Extended Learning Opportunities (ELO)

Empowering all New Hampshire students to make the world their classroom and earn credit for real world learning. (NHELO Vision Statement)

ELOs provide educational experiences that are meaningful and relevant to student interests and future pursuits. Through Extended Learning Opportunities (ELO), students at Exeter High School acquire knowledge and skills from instruction or study that takes place outside the traditional classroom.

High school credit can be earned for activities including, but not limited to: independent study, private instruction, team sports, performing groups, internships, community service, and work study. Granting of credit is based on demonstration of course competencies, as approved by certified school personnel. Credit may be used toward elective or graduation requirements.

Once the student decides on an interesting topic to learn more about, he or she is expected to connect with an adult mentor to develop the specifics of the ELO. The student completes a detailed application, presents a proposal to the ELO committee, and receives approval to begin his or her study. Exeter School District is not responsible for any cost incurred from a student's participation in an ELO.

While engaged in the ELO, the student holds pre-arranged meetings with his or her mentor. The purpose of meeting is to monitor progress and address any concerns. With the help of the mentor, the student will decide the product(s) he or she will use to demonstrate learning for the final presentation.

The student will make a final presentation to the ELO Committee. The student's mentor is invited to attend. Credit is awarded once the student demonstrates evidence of learning to the satisfaction of the ELO Committee. Only a completed ELO that is awarded credit appears on the student's Exeter High School Transcript.

The student whose ELO is a class from an accredited institution will provide the Exeter High School Guidance Department with an official transcript from the institution. The student will share his or her experience with the ELO Committee as a final presentation.
