Underage access to alcohol continues to be an issue in New Hampshire. When asked, 37.6% of New Hampshire high school students responded that, if they wanted, it would be very easy for them to get alcohol. (NH Youth Risk Behavior Survey, Question 125.) In addition to the health and legal concerns, underage drinking is often connected to sexual assaults, traffic accidents and vandalism.

Local law enforcement personnel would much rather respond to underage age drinking as early as possible; ideally this would be during the planning stages. If you have information or a concern about underage drinking, you can make a report to any of the contacts listed below. Please be sure to speak directly with someone when reporting. Also, if you have a high school student and you are planning on being out of town, even for just one night, local law enforcement personnel will check your home at your request.
